4:40-4:55	15	<p>SHAC Updates – Nurse Reyes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Call to order ● Set goals for the year: Nurse Reyes proposed several discussion questions in order to pinpoint what the goals for the year should be. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. What three things do you like best about our schools? Members stated Security, small class size, Sense of Community, and good school lunches. B. If you could change one thing about our schools, what would it be? Member stated that her HS student has not gone to the library this school year and is not required to read at home. Members hope this will change. Other members stated that the students may not be going to the library, but that they do have required readings in their class. Another member stated that kids are not eating healthy meals and their main source of food is Burger King and Dairy Queen. Recommendations to see if Mrs. Earnhardt, cafeteria manager, would be able to bring back the shared fruit bin. Discussion regarding community garden, school garden and greenhouse at the HS. Nurse Reyes stated she would discuss the Learn, Grow, Eat and Go gardening program with Molly Flores. Mr. Grill stated the greenhouse was damaged by hail. Members brought up concern that lights in the parking lot are out and very dark in the am. Very dark in the morning at junior high football practice drop off at field house and high traffic and speeders on street next to field house. Another member suggested adding health class into the curriculum to be able to deliver sex education classes, nutrition education, social skills, and coping skills. C. What worries you most about your children and their lives now? Several members stated eating healthy, lack of social skills and coping skills, especially seen with technology and covid. D. What is one wish that you have for your children? Many members stated for children to succeed academically, and make healthy connections. E What could families do to make the community a better place to live? Teacher member stated that parents are not communicating with staff. Another member stated some parents feel like they are unable to approach. Another member suggested having a parent liaison. F. What could this SHAC do to make this community a better place to live? Community gardens, have more events for kids/family, having the

Also college offers Wellness Wednesdays where different agencies come to the college cafeteria and have booths available. Another member suggested having once a semester a Saturday event for those parents that work and are not able to attend weekday events such as six weeks awards or parent picnics.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Team had great discussions about the school, community, and parental involvement ● Puberty program for elementary school-parents has stated that the children need some guidance, but must meet the state requirements of providing a notice to parents 14 days prior and parents must opt-in for their child to attend classes. Looking at providing classes for 4-6th graders. Discussed possibility of UMH providing MD's to have a few puberty sessions with those classes. ● SHAC sub-committee will meet to discuss the same questions and then propose three goals for the year. ● Sub-committee meeting scheduled for 10/12/22 and one on 11/9/22
